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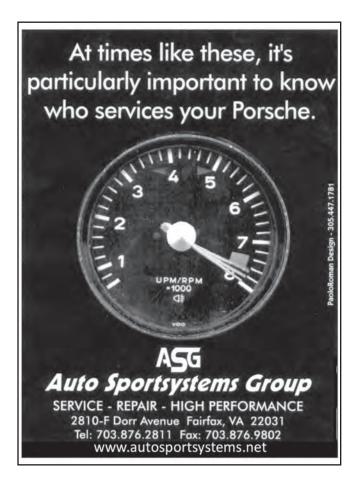

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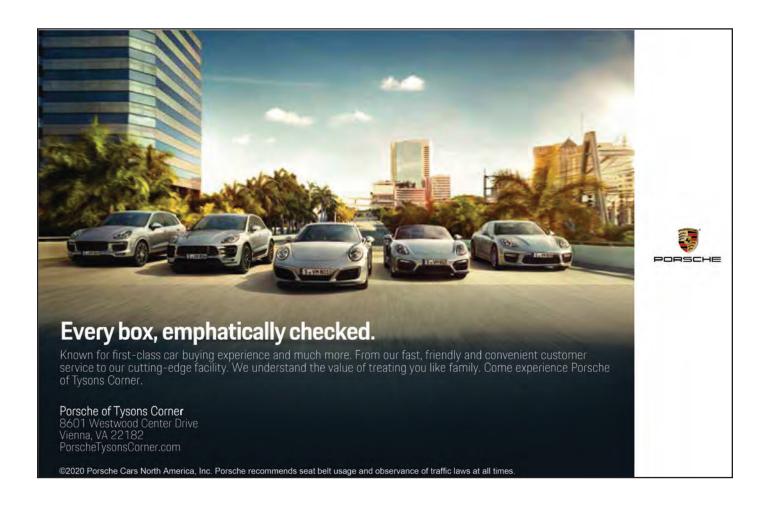

The generosity of the PCA Potomac Chapter was overflowing again this holiday season. The Chapter partnered with House to Home Solutions in Rockville, Maryland, to receive donations for the Marine Toys for Tots program. Donations were received at the House to Home Solutions Design Center as well as the PCA Potomac Holiday Party at Clyde's. The donated toys overflowed the donation boxes. Toys for all ages were donated, from toddlers to teens and included toys from Star Wars' Grogu, Barbie, Legos, R/C Cars and more.

Supporting the Next Generation of Automotive Technicians

PCA Potomac has formed a new partnership with the Montgomery College Automotive Technology Program, supporting the next generation of automotive technicians. The Automotive Technology Program, located on the Rockville Campus in the Homer S. Gudelsky Institute for Technical Education, offers an Associates of Applied Science degree and also certificates of completion in specialty areas.

The Community Service chairs met with the Program's Director, Michael Carretta, to learn about the various academic offerings available and to explore ways PCA Potomac could provide help to their students. Recalling the investment that many of us amateurs have made in our tools, we realized this was an area of need for future automotive specialists as they enter the industry, especially because automotive technicians typically are required to bring their own tools to the job. The Montgomery College program currently has a partnership with Snap-On that allows for a 50% discount for their students, so the dollars we collect will have twice the impact! (pun intended).

Students earning an Associate's degree will be eligible for a "PCA Potomac Chapter Tool Scholarship," funded by generous donations from club members, to help the selected graduates launch into their careers as Automotive Technicians with the tools needed for their trade. 

AUTOCROSS

Whether you're a seasoned pro or just dipping your toe into competitive motorsports, PCA Autocross is an excellent program for you. Autocross is a competitive, low-speed (up to 60 mph or so) driving event focused on vehicle handling, driver skill, and precision maneuvering. Each month, drivers navigate a unique course in a time trial to demonstrate their driving ability and try to snag the coveted Fastest Time of Day (FTD) honor.

Though each course is unique, drivers will see familiar elements across events: slaloms, traction circles, and hard-braking turns are frequent challenges in many courses. Throughout the Autocross season, returning drivers have

the opportunity to develop their skills on these—and other—elements, training themselves to drive more effectively on street and track alike.

The Autocross program is returning off a successful 2022 season, which saw nearly 70 drivers at each of its monthly events, including an increase in diverse drivers from a range of backgrounds. The Autocross committee hopes to build on this success in 2023, bringing even more new and experienced drivers to the pavement to drive, learn, and meet new and exciting people!

Autocross participation is \$55 a day for PCA members and \$70 for non-members. For new or new-to-Autocross drivers, the committee hosts an educational school at the beginning of the season. We hope to see you there!

PCA Potomac hosts a club race every year at Summit Point Motorsports Park, and this year's race weekend is September 15-17, 2023. The race is one event out of a series of 25+ races held annually by the PCA National Club Racing Program at racetracks across North America.

Our event attracts 120-150 racers each year, about 30% of these from the Potomac Region. Racers must meet the national licensing requirements and prepare a Porsche car in accordance with the rules; see https://pcaclubracing.org/rules/ for more information if you are interested in becoming a PCA club racer. You can get up close to the action during the race weekend by volunteering to help. It takes over 100 volunteers to handle registration, welcome participants and

guests, grid cars, flag at corner stations, set up happy hours and dinners, manage traffic in the paddock, assist timing & scoring, and help with tech inspection and scales. We promise you'll have fun and see great cars and great racing. Volunteer registration opens in July, and the link to register will be announced in the weekly eBlast and in der Vorgänger. No experience is needed for many positions, and we're always happy to train newcomers.

If you are interested but don't want to jump right into the volunteer pool just yet, mark your calendar and come on out and watch the racing. Friday is mostly a practice day. Each race group gets two 30-minutes sprint races on Saturday. Sunday has a third sprint race for vintage cars, and a 90 minute "enduro" for the other racers.

PCA Potomac strives to help those in our community thrive. We support a diverse program of community service outreach each year to help those in need, so all can succeed.

The 2023 Community Service programs start with a new partnership with Montgomery College's Automotive Technology Program, funding a Tool Scholarship for an outstanding graduate(s) to help launch their new automotive career. With over half of all college students struggling financially, this partnership will help ease the financial burdens of launching a new career in the automotive industry.

Camp Porsche will again be held this summer. Local youth will again enjoy a day at the track, safely exposing them to the car enthusiast world and providing them with a fun summer day filled with track activities to explore.

The community thrive focus continues with donations for local food banks, warm coat drives, and pet food drives for local animal shelters. Helping our veterans continues to be a focus too. Participants in our PorscheFest DE will participate in the Track Heroes program to facilitate their recovery from PTSD and other trauma-related challenges. The Inaugural PCA Founder's Region Concours d'Elegance is expected to be scheduled for Sunday, May 7, 2023, and to take place at Tysons II in McLean, Va. We expect to offer sandwiches from Maggiano's as part of the registration fee rather than wine/cheese from past Concours. We anticipate there will be approximately 100 judges, cars including many in a new GT category joining the prior categories from 356s to present-day Taycans, SUVs and sedans. Moreover, we anticipate sponsors and giveaways for the first time in several years. This location is an improvement over Occoquan, especially for our Maryland members, and is expected to draw a number of spectators from the mall who would not otherwise attend at a remote location.

Though our initial event location is not yet finalized, we anticipate that it will be shortly, in a central, and populated, location for the first time while providing the opportunity for shopping and food alternatives to those attending.

The Tech Inspection program supports the Drivers Education program, but it is also a great resource for those wishing to learn more about their cars. For DE events, each car requires two types of safety-related inspections - a Pre-Event Inspection at a shop (aka Shop Tech), and a Grid Tech inspection early each morning at the track. The Shop Tech inspection must be performed no more than 30 days prior to a DE event. The inspection includes a review of the safety gear in the passenger compartment, the suspension and drivetrain components, and the braking system. The car is also checked for fluid leaks, or poor hose connections that

could fail on the track. The Shop Tech inspection can be performed by a dealership or independent repair shop, but PCA Potomac holds a Shop Tech prior to each DE that is free for the DE participants and other Potomac members. These events are hosted by dealerships and shops in Northern Virginia and Maryland, and staffed by Volunteers from the Club. During the inspections we encourage the car owner to accompany the inspectors so they can get a firsthand look at the underside of their car. The Shop Tech schedule for 2023 is posted on the PCA Potomac website. Five of the eight events are currently confirmed. **DV**

With my retirement several years ago, my youngest son Bryant and I had planned a trip to Germany to take in the major automotive car museums. But, as you might have guessed, those plans got shelved due to the pandemic. With a return to normalcy this fall we decided the time was right to take our muchanticipated trip. So, in mid-October, off we went for a nine-day autothemed adventure across Bavaria. Fitful sleep on the late-evening Lufthansa flight from Dulles to Munich eased the inevitable jet lag adjustment.

Stuttgart

Porsche: All of the major automotive museums we toured shared a similar design feature: visitors ascend several levels to begin their view of early efforts, and then descend through time with themed exhibits of the marque's most noteworthy models. As you would expect, Porsche starts with "Nr. I", Ferdinand's prototype 356 Gmünd roadster from 1948. The museum hosts an ever-changing display of 80 notable cars from their collection including sports cars, legendary race cars and prototype design studies that influenced future production models.

along with displays of noteworthy engineering items and innovative designs. Also of note: The vehicles displayed do not have barriers and can be closely inspected.

Mercedes-Benz: We were most impressed with the size and breadth of the nine-level Mercedes Museum, understandable given their long history and diversity of transport types, each given its due. To add perspective, the outside walls contain pictures and narrative of historical relevance to the corresponding era of vehicle displays.







Appropriately, your tour starts here with "Nr. 1", the 1948 356 Prototype. Rejoice Boxster fans, the roadster is mid-engined!





Mercedes' walk through time starts with a horse and a 1886 quote from German Kaiser Wilhelm II: "I do believe in the horse. The automobile is no more than a transitory phenomenon." (Nostradamus he was not.) This immediately transitions into a presentation of the first gasoline-engined automobile: a three-wheeled, single-cylinder Benz patent motor car. The expansive 178,000 sq. ft. of exhibition space is divided into the "legend rooms" and the "collections," generally themed by era and type.

Ingolstadt

Audi: On our mid-week visit to the Audi museum, it was not crowded. Fortunately, we struck up a conversation with an Audi Museum guide and had a long and insightful chat as we walked through the museum; he identified the finer points and historical significance of the many displays. In general, Audi's presentation spans the history of the brand started in 1910 with displays of the early brands that formed Auto Union in 1932 (Horch, DKW, Audi and Wanderer, and later NSU), the Silver Arrows, and the more recent decades of models of GT and Quattro rally cars.

We also took the factory tour and walked the production line from the start where blank sheets of metal are stamped to form the body panels, leading ultimately to a completed vehicle drive-off at the end of the line. Interestingly, all A3s, regardless of configuration, are made on the same line, including right-hand drive models. Our guide told us Audi sells right-hand drive vehicles in more than 50 countries! While we were there, A4 production was suspended due to lingering supply-chain issues, in part because of a shortage of wiring harnesses from Ukraine.

Munich

BMW Museum and Welt

BMW is currently celebrating the 50th Anniversary of their M-designated vehicles, so through the end of this year the museum is prominently displaying many of the rarely seen cars under the M brand. Regular collections spanning the history of the company remain, including motorcycles. As with the other German car museums, visitors start with the earliest offerings and descend through levels surrounded by themed exhibitions by era and type.

Deutsches Museum

Munich's Deutsches Museum offers two sites of interest for vehicle fans. Most specifically, the Verkehrszentrum ("transport museum") is focused on the history of all manner of transportation spread across three buildings with 250 separate exhibits: bicycles, motorcycles, cars, buses, trucks and trains. The primary Deutsches Museum, located near Munich city center, ranges generally through science and technology, with prominent displays of commercial, military and general aviation.

General Walkabout München

I'd be remiss if I didn't mention what a wonderful city Munich proved to be — lively, vibrant, and diverse. The timing of our visit also seemed to be beneficial, falling after Oktoberfest and before the Christmas festivities, although much could be said in favor of either. Exploring by foot throughout the city center plazas, marketplace shops, sidewalk restaurants, cafes and good old-fashioned biergartens was a genuine delight. And, of course, there's a Beer and Oktoberfest Museum in Munich, but you'll have to look that one up yourself. **DV**

If You Go...

Apps to plan your journey: Your smartphone is an indispensable tool and tour guide. We used Google Maps, which were accurate and reliable, especially to track local train time tables and routes. (And by "we" I mean my technically proficient son.) It was especially helpful when on the go and our plans changed to accommodate our flexible schedule. You can also scan and translate text, particularly helpful if your restaurant doesn't have menus in English.

Plan Ahead: All the car museums are closed on Mondays but are otherwise open year-round. We worked around that by selecting other sites and city adventures on Monday. But as many manufacturers also offer factory tours in close proximity to their museums, you can combine your visit by taking in both. While admission to the museums is easy, tours need a reservation. It's best to check each company's website and purchase your tickets in advance. And Porsche and BMW discount admission tickets to club members, so bring your membership card.

Cars – we love 'em. But for travel through large Bavarian urban areas they are a hindrance. We traveled exclusively by intercity trains, the U-Bahn (subway), and taxi. We found that most efficient for everywhere we went, including a day trip to Salzburg and an overnight to Stuttgart. A car about town is unnecessary and frankly a burden. Or as a Hertz counter clerk in Stuttgart once told me when explaining their courtesy buses weren't running, "You must go zer by your feeets."

Do be mindful of the "rules of the road" as you stroll about. Pedestrians and bicycles share separate portions of the same sidewalk — really something quite different than what we're used to at home. And those new e-bikes are quick and stealthy, especially as everyone seems to be dressed in black.

And do take a break and have a sit-down at a café near any intersection and witness a non-stop extemporaneous parade of German cars we just don't see here in the States. It's a rolling German car show!


