



### AN ENTHUSIAST'S **Savory Model Collection**

What's your excuse? C'mon, every Porsche enthusiast has a few mini-icons – from T-shirts to key fobs, even model cars – lying around. For some of us, though, it goes over the top. Perhaps you can relate.

My father seeded my passion for models. He built real airplanes during World War II (after his draft-physical physician burst out laughing that he had never seen such flat feet). When I started reacting to aircraft, the craftsman in my father responded with a few plastic model kits. He built, and I watched. When I soon tried my hand, I had far too little patience, but that came later. The realization of my Porsche passion, in my late 30s, coincided with the arrival on our shores of precision plastic kits, plus enough maturity on my part to work carefully. The problem was the paint's natural attraction to dust, plus the fragility of plastic shaped to small precision parts (think suspension arms). But then came the pre-built die-cast metal model cars. What I could not afford in full size, I bought in 1:18 (or 1:43 if necessary) scale – plus absolutely any Porsche I could find in Matchbox size.

My first purchases were scattershot — whatever Porsche became available at a reasonable price. But with greater availability came selectivity. It started with models of the Porsches I owned; a 944 Turbo appeared. That branch of the collection is now capped by a 2016 Cayman GT4 that by blessed coincidence precisely matches my current track-day car — the color, the wheels, even the seats.

I had the very good fortune in 2007 to meet and spend time with Timo Bernhard. So the collection now includes every available car that Timo drove – his winners from Daytona, the Nürburgring, and Sebring (the RS Spyder that he was driving when we first met, autographed) – plus several 911s recently campaigned by Team Bernhard 75, which he founded upon his retirement from driving in 2019. The prize of that last group is the car that achieved the team's first victory in the headline DTM series.


But very early on, the Timo collection started me down the track at Le Mans. As I reorganized the display months ago, I realized I was close to a complete set of Porsche Le Mans overall winners (plus the iconic 1951 356 SL class winner – the first Porsche to compete at the 24 Hours). So I went hunting, including the pre-owned market, and sealed the

deal. To accompany the overall winners, I have the "hippy" car of 1970, the "pink pig" of 1971, the most successful 1969 917 with that year's 908 runner-up, the "Moby Dick" 935, and the 911 class winner of 2018 (I was lucky enough to be there).

And no Timo collection would be complete without the 919 Tribute car in which he demolished the all-time track record at the Nürburgring Nordschleife. When that model was first issued, further search uncovered a magnificent 1:12 scale model of the Porsche 956 in which Stefan Belloff, one of Timo's heroes, had set the previous record 35 years earlier. Those two sit together in a place of honor.

Oh, some other Porsches, notably the Dan Gurney 804 that achieved Porsche's only Formula One World Championship victory at Rouen in 1962, and the 1985 McLaren TAG-Porsche world champion driven by Alain Prost. And other cars — the Gurney Eagle that won at Spa, the 1961 Phil Hill Monza Ferrari 156 "Sharknose," the 1957 Juan Manuel Fangio Maserati 250F winner at the Nürburgring, a Bernd Rosemeyer Auto Union...



# MY FIRST PORSCHE


Recently, we asked our members to recall stories of their early ownership experiences. What each told us was wonderful!



### **OH, MY! LET'S GET READY TO CRUMBLE**

### DR. JOHN KLISH, 356B

My first Porsche was a 1962 356B Super 90 Cabriolet. It sounds impressive until you look at the picture. I bought it in the summer of 1969, just before my second year of dental school. The reaction of my then-girlfriend, standing in the background, says it all. The 356 was rusty and beat up, but driving it was incredibly fun! I've had consecutive Porsches ever since.



### WAIT. WHAT?

### **GLENN HAVINOVISKI, 2008 CAYMAN**

My first Porsche was a brand-new 2008 987.1 Cayman—base model, 2.7L with a 5-speed manual—in Ruby Red over Sand Beige, ordered from Porsche Tysons Corner.

We got used to perplexed stares when driving through small towns. "What is that?" was a common gas station question. Once, a distinguished gentleman with a flawless black C2 Corvette at the next pump professed his admiration for the car.

Thanks to its front and rear cargo space, I often used the Cayman for tasks that would seem unusual for a sports car. I'd arrive at hotel conferences with folding booth equipment in the back and a box of brochures in the front. When I popped the frunk, valets would ask, "Well, where's the engine?"

One night, dressed in formalwear, we pulled into the Reagan International Building garage for a holiday reception. Under the entrance driveway was a trench where government inspectors examined the car's underside with a large mirror on a stick. Like other modern Porsches, the chassis was covered in plastic panels. They asked me to open the engine compartment, and I had to explain that I hadn't brought my Torx screwdrivers to remove the panel behind the seats. Eventually, they gave up after one agent muttered, "Nothing to see here," and the supervisor said, "Have a nice night!"



### THE FLYING HAWAIIAN

#### JIM HENRY, 1972 911T

It was 1975. I was a 28-year-old U.S. Army Captain stationed in Hawaii. One day, a Warrant Officer rolled into our unit driving an Irish Green '69 911T. I had a Fiat 124 Spyder, but after seeing that 911, I knew I had to trade up.



Just before I left Hawaii, one of my NCOs made me a parting gift: a unique plaque featuring two of my favorite machines. A model Huey helicopter cleverly fused with a 911, painted in our VIP livery.

After some searching, I found my first Porsche: a 1972 Alpine White 911T practically calling my name. My thenwife thought I was crazy for spending \$9,500 on a used car. (As an aside: parked next to it was a Ferrari Dino 246 GTS I could've had for \$13,000. Ain't hindsight grand?)

Not long after, the car dropped a chain tensioner, which destroyed the valves and damaged the pistons. I had the engine rebuilt as close as possible to Carrera RS specs: 2.7L, 10.5:1 pistons, Nikasil cylinders, peaky 911E cams, and a fuel injection pump tuned to match.

It was super quick—but lacked the suspension and brakes to match the power. Still, it was a blast to drive.

I shipped the Porsche to the West Coast, planning to drive it cross-country to my next assignment at Fort Dix, New Jersey.

With my shoebox-sized FuzzBuster radar detector perched on the dash, I made the trip in record time—with no tickets! I drove the car for three more years in New Jersey before selling it ahead of another overseas tour.



### **MY FIRST LOVE**

### **MICHAEL HUNTER, 2002 BOXSTER**

I was so excited to purchase my first—and only—Porsche back in 2002. I could hardly believe it... I was actually buying a Porsche, my childhood dream car. I had customized my first love, so I had to wait four to five months to take delivery. I tracked the car every day on the shipment portal—until one terrible day.

As I was watching TV, I saw news of a cargo ship sinking into the ocean—one of the largest and most expensive shipping incidents in history. The vessel was carrying Porsches and other luxury cars bound for the Baltimore Inner Harbor. I panicked and immediately called my Porsche dealership to check on the status of my car.

It took 48 agonizing hours to get a response—the longest wait of my young life. Then, finally, I got the call. The sweetest words I've ever heard: "Congrats, your new Porsche Boxster convertible is at the dealership. Come on down to see her."


